Description of the Instrument

- The checklist was designed to increase parental awareness of potential home hazards and risk to children.
- This 25-item questionnaire assesses parent's behaviour related to injury prevention, fire and electrical safety, firearm storage, poison prevention, automobile safety, and child supervision.
- Each item is answered "yes" or "no".

Form of instrument:

- Checklists
- Questionnaire/ Survey
- Hazard/Risk Assessment Tools

Method of delivery:

- In-person interview/assessment
- Self-Report

Relevance to injury/ Percentage of the instrument specific to injury

- To assess the parent's behaviour which could directly affect children's health and safety (e.g. keeping matches and lighters away from children to reduce fire injuries and deaths).

Time to administer or complete the instrument

Methods of data analyses:

- Quantitative

- 1,143 parents of children attending the eight pre-school programs included in the study.
